ABOUT THE FIRM

A brief history of the office follows

Sporleder Architects emerged in January 1991 with offices at 511 West Colfax in downtown South Bend, Indiana and currently (1992 to present) at 205 West Cripe Street South Bend, IN 46637

Crumlish/Sporleder and Associates, Inc., the predecessor firm, was begun in 1965 at Notre Dame, Indiana. The principals, Donald Sporleder, President, and Brian Crumlish, Secretary, deceased 1997, maintained a staff of three to fifteen persons over the years. In December 1990, this firm dissolved and evolved into two separate firms. The principals set up separate offices of their own, and continued practice and teaching as Professors of Architecture at the University of Notre Dame. The Crumlish/Sporleder offices were first located at 100 Center, Mishawaka, Indiana. Here the firm undertook a major adaptive use and restoration project, transformation of the abandoned Kamm Schellinger Brewery into the bustling 100 Center Complex with shops, restaurants, galleries, theaters, and housing. In 1972, after the sale of 100 Center to new owners, the firm relocated to the Birdsell Mansion, 511 W. Colfax in downtown South Bend, Indiana.

The firm provided professional services in the field of architecture, planning, urban design, and historic preservation. The firm grew out of the principals' earlier association on the development of the West Pakistan Agricultural University in Lyallpur, West Pakistan, and their second place award in the University College Dublin, Ireland, International Design Competition. Early works of the firm included urban design and downtown renewal planning for communities in Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, New York, Minnesota, and completed projects in New Jersey, Florida, Hawaii and Thailand.

The firm surveyed and inventoried historic sites, structures and districts in South Bend, Fort Wayne, and St. Joseph County in Indiana, and in Niles, Michigan. Adaptive use/renovation work done by the firm included the renovation of the old Kamm and Shillinger Brewery in Mishawaka into a bustling mixed use development now called 100 Center; the restoration of the 1869 Sheriff's house in Berrien Springs, Michigan; the conversion of the old South Bend Lathe Works (former Singer Manufacturing Plant), into the Spaghetti Works Restaurant and the Works Hotel; and restoration of the Sutherland Home into a conference/visitors' center for Andrews University, in Berrien Springs, Michigan. The firm was involved in a number of church projects, including both new construction and renovation work. These include Queen of Peace, Mishawaka, First United Methodist, Chesterton, The Evangelical Free Church, St. Joseph, Michigan, Hope Chapel Church of God, South Bend, and renovation and addition to the historic First Presbyterian Church, Noblesville, IN.

Park and recreation planning, design and architecture was another major area of the firm's work. Past projects included the first county park in Elkhart County, Ox Bow Park, in Dunlap; Bonnyville Mill, Middlebury; the Sugar House at Bendix Woods Park, St. Joseph County; Madeline Bertrand Park, Berrien County, Michigan, Roseland Town Park, East Bank Trail Studies, and the South Bend to Lake Michigan Rails to Trails Corridor.

University planning and facilities design included the master plans for University College Dublin, Ireland, Kasetsart University, Bangkok, Thailand, and the West Pakistan Agricultural University in Lyallpur, West Pakistan. Another significant project--commissioned upon winning the design competition--was the Ball State University, College of Architecture and Planning addition and the State Energy Research Center completed in 1983-84.

Recent projects of Sporleder Architects include the West Chapin Street corridor urban design study--West Washington Neighborhood Association; residences -- Indiana & Michigan, and a historic house restoration and addition in Edwardsburg, Michigan. In 1993-94 Sporleder served as a member of the St. Joseph County/South Bend, Indiana Building Department's Energy Task Force.

Other recent projects include a 1880 historic house renovation and addition in Dowagiac, Michigan; a town cultural centre, adaptive use project, the historic St. Patrick's Church renovation in Chesterton, IN; renovation and restoration of the landmark 1882 Chapin House in Niles, MI, as the Nile's City Hall & Fort St. Joseph Museum; addition to a 1884 historic house, renovation of the old Broadway Hotel in South Bend, IN, for the "Life Treatment Center", a diagnostic, rehabilitation center and halfway house facility, a joint venture w/ Architect Design Group; and consulting work/building committee member, on the 1st Presbyterian Church chapel, church, and site renovation in downtown South Bend, and now serves on the Long range planning committee. Assisted Division of Planning and Neighborhood Development, Fall 1997, Planning for South Bend's Neighborhoods, "Building the Legacy". Present work underway includes: Design consultation, and Greenway and rails/trails planning and development --Plymouth Industrial Track rail-trail corridor, City of South Bend; the Darden Bridge to Clay Twp. Park Riverbank Trail, Clay Township; the Big Bluestem/LaSalle Trail, cooperative intergovernmental development, with Roseland Town Park Board and St. Joseph County Park Board; and the South Bend to Potato Creek State Park and on to Dillon, LaPorte County Greenway. He served on the Steering Committee for the St Joseph River Watershed Management Plan 2005, and is on the Steering Committee for the Michiana Region Greenways, Planning Charrette, 2005, and on going implementation. He served as Chairman, 2007-9, Facilities & Grounds, Northern IN History Center & continues as member, Facilities & Grounds. History Museum

During the academic years 1994-95, 95-96, and Spring Semester 97, Sporleder served as a faculty member with the University of Notre Dame Architecture Studies Program in Rome, Italy (coursework: architecture design, drawing/water color, and field trip lectures--and assisted in set up of computer clusters, local area network and internet computer link in Rome, during spring semesters in 1997 & 98). He also served as acting director of the Rome Studies Program in 1970-71, and as faculty with the Rome program in 1987-88. He served in 1996 and 1997 on the building committee and Deacon's Court with Saint Andrew's Church of Scotland in Rome, Italy. In September 2008, Don and Joann Sporleder, led a group of traveling Irish, NDI on a tour through Tuscany.
