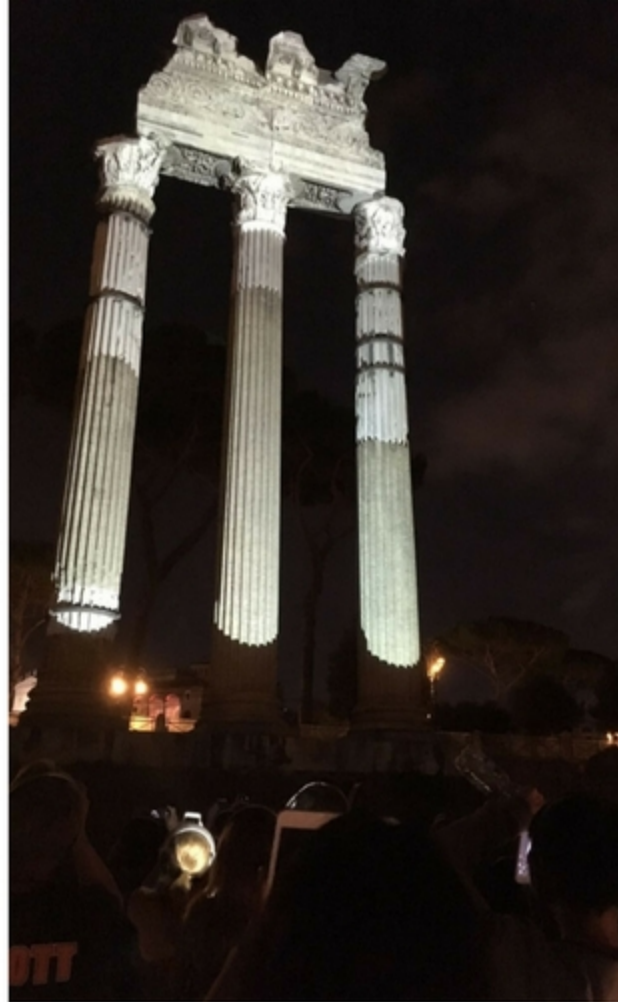


THE YEAR BEGINS...
