INTERNSHIP AND TRAVELING FELLOWSHIP AWARD

2022

AWARD:

Ten week paid internship at the office of David M. Schwarz Architects (DMSAS) in Washington, DC and a \$7,500 stipend for travel and independent research during the summer of 2022.

ELIGIBILITY:

Two annual awards open to Undergraduate & Graduate students who are one year from graduation.

- One Undergraduate Student (*Fourth Year*)
- One Graduate Student (*first year path A or B, second year path C, or about to enter Path D*)

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Statement of Intent for Travel and Research
- Proposed Summer Schedule for Internship and Travel
- Estimated Budget for Use of Travel Stipend
- Portfolio
- Resume (1 page)

TIMELINE:

- Applications due 5:00 PM Wednesday, February 16, 2022.
- Awards announced on Wednesday, February 23, 2022.

RECIPIENT OBLIGATIONS:

- *Coordinate dates of internship (minimum of ten consecutive weeks) and travel with DMSAS.*
- *Provide documentation of completed Fellowship to DMSAS and School of Architecture.*
- *Give presentation/exhibit on Fellowship to School of Architecture during 2022 Fall Semester.*
- *Give presentation on Fellowship to DMSAS during final academic year or after graduation.*

Note: Due to the required work component of the Fellowship and the length of time it takes to obtain a work permit, this award is open only to American citizens or permanent residents. Funding for travel is intended to be the primary use of the stipend. Any remaining monies may be used for the recipient's educational expenses including tuition, books and fees. DMSAS will award the stipend through the School of Architecture who will oversee its direct dispensation. Travel to/from Washington, DC and housing & living expenses are at recipient's expense.
