COURSES TAUGHT

ARCH 11021 – GRAPHICS II: a lecture / studio course for freshmen students seeking a Bachelor of Architecture, introducing the pencil and watercolor graphic skills necessary to illustrate architectural designs and concepts. 4 credit hours
